PINOLE BOOK-SIGNING PARTY AUGUST 5

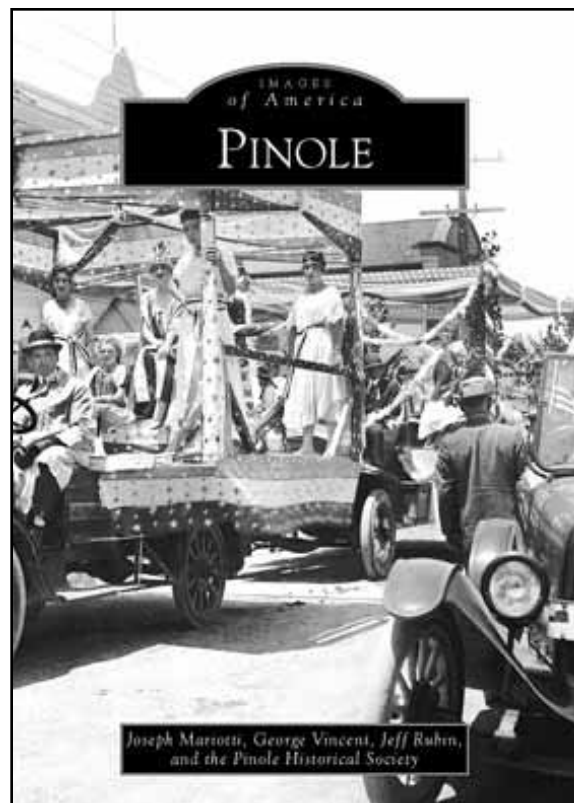

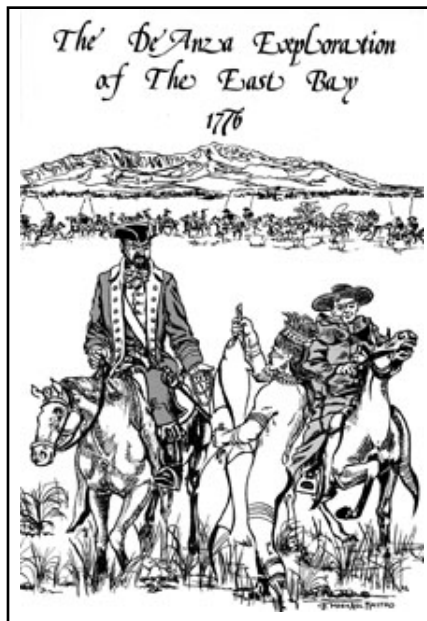

President's Message

THE BOOK IS HERE—FINALLY!

By the time you have read this newsletter our book, *Images of America: Pinole*, will have arrived from Arcadia Publishing.

What a process it's been. From the initial excitement of being approached by Arcadia, through the eight months spent putting the book together, to waiting from February (when it was submitted to Arcadia), to July for the books to arrive—the anticipation has been incredible.

And now our first nationally published book is here.

Having a book published about history of Pinole is very important to the city, and its citizens. Knowing how the city started, who made it grow and gave it its personality, how it has evolved over the last nearly 200 years, gives us insight into who we are, where we've been, and who we want to be.

The content of the book is a reflection of

the true spirit of Pinole.

From the early Martinez family who settled this land, to the pioneers who came here in the mid and late 19th century and early 20th century, to the people and events that gave our city an identity, Pinole has always had an admirable and undeniable strength of spirit.

That spirit of cooperation was evidenced in the development of our book. Take a look at the Acknowledgments section; it's probably one of the longest in Arcadia's history—and they've published more than 5,000 titles! People gave us photos and artifacts, helped us track down the hidden or not-so-well-known history of our city. What a collaboration!

My thanks to Joe Mariotti, George Vincent, and Jeff Rubin for all of the hours they devoted to collecting the material, writing the text, and scanning the more than 200 photos in the book.

Please join us Wednesday, August 5, from 6 to 8 p.m., for our book-launching/signing event in the Alex Clark Room. The authors will be there to sign your books, and it will give all of us an opportunity to celebrate the history of the city.

We thank the city of Pinole for a grant so we could have this party.

MUSEUM UPDATE:

On Wednesday, July 29, the PHS board will meet with the city's museum consultant, Kathleen Brown, to discuss the budget process for our proposed historical museum.

This is the next step in a six-month-long feasibility study that Brown conducted. The initial results showed that the city could support a museum; this meeting will detail exactly how we should go about doing it.

We look forward to seeing you at our September 17th membership meeting. Our August meeting will be the book signing on the 5th.

PINOLE'S BIG HOLE ON THE HILL

The entrance to Pinole Valley is flanked by two imposingly large hills. The one south of Interstate 80 is called Faria's Hill. North of the freeway, atop the other hill, is a landmark called the Pinole Reservoir.

The need for fresh water has always been crucial to Pinole's development. The first Native American inhabitants settled their villages near Pinole Creek's waters.

Generally following the route of 1772 explorer Don Pedro Fages and diarist Padre Juan Crespi, on April 1, 1776, a Spanish expedition led by Juan Bautista de Anza camped at the base of

Faria's Hill next to Pinole Creek. Pinole's first settlers, the Martinez family, also built their adobe homes in the 1830s adjacent to Pinole Creek's life-giving waters.

Nineteenth-century Pinoleans depended primarily on wells, cisterns, and wooden water tanks. But water was always in short supply as the town grew. In the late 1800s, the California Powder Works needed water for its expanding plant. From the Tennent family it purchased a high hill west of Pinole Creek.

In 1898, construction

began on the cement-lined reservoir that was finished in the fall of 1902. Water was pumped up from a dam in Pinole Creek, and then piped to the powder company, as well as the growing towns of Pinole and Hercules.

The Hercules Water Company owned the reservoir, which was very large for its time. It sat on a hilltop covering 4.3 acres. Its depth was 37 feet and covered an area of 32,400 square feet. Its volume had a capacity of 8,728,621 gallons of water. The entire reservoir was covered by a wooden roof.

Early residents used the utility boat inside the reservoir for recreational rowing with their sweethearts.

The reservoir was abandoned in 1934 due to seepage and leakage, which caused landslides, especially on the eastern slopes. By 1936, it had been purchased by EBMUD, but wasn't used.

Fearsome goats, cattle, and a caretaker's shack guarded the hillsides

around the reservoir. Locals climbed its poppy-covered slopes and braved the climb down the rusty metal ladder to the dry reservoir bottom.

By 1966, the reservoir had been purchased by a Pinole service organization that envisioned turning it into a community center. The plan did not materialize, and in 1978, the reservoir parcel was purchased by Joseph and Gretchen Mariotti to save as open space.

Today, the reservoir sits as an empty monument to the past and the graffiti of the present. But it once stimulated the growth of the cities of Pinole and Hercules as it supplied their thirsty needs.

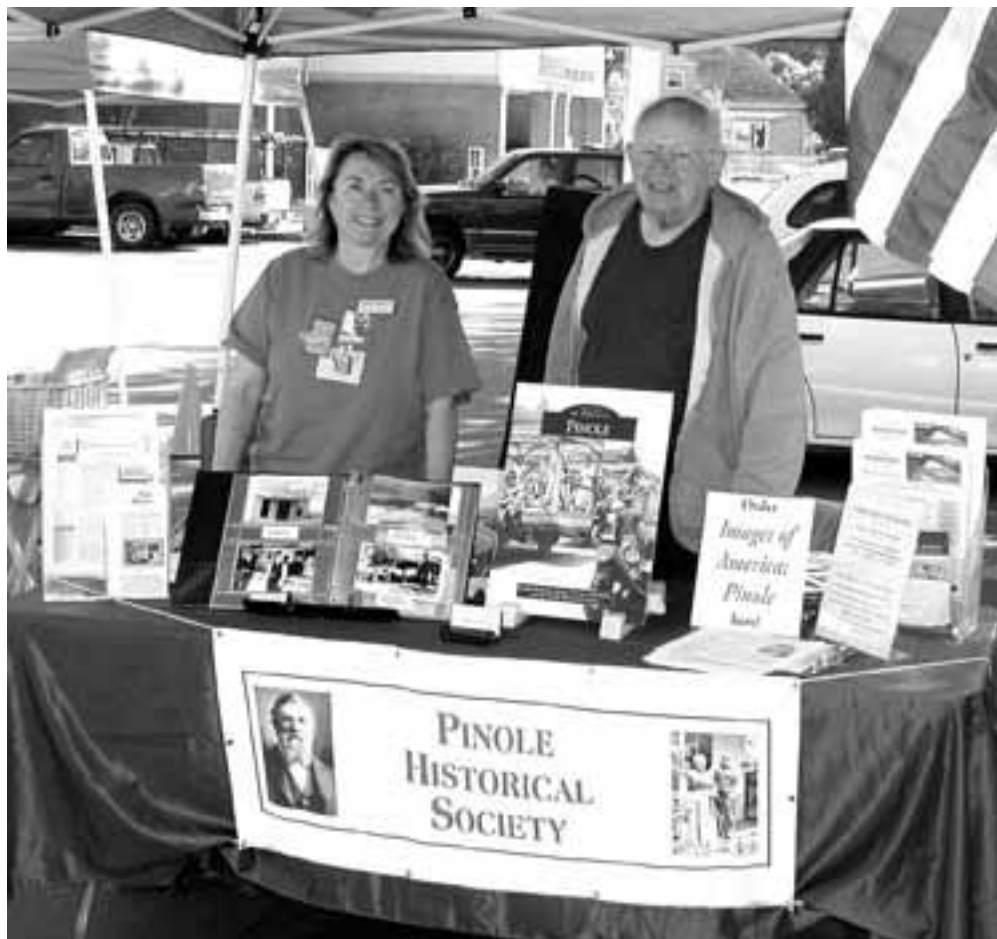

It happened back then . . .

1894: Manuel Fernandez, a medical student, and Edward M. Downer, Southern Pacific Depot agent, start Pinole's first newspaper, *The Pinole Weekly Times*, in a small building at the Fernandez Mansion.

June 25, 1903: New Town of Pinole's first council meeting in Old Plaza Schoolhouse on School Street. Members elected to Board of Trustees, City Clerk, Marshall, and Treasurer.

November 1903: Miss Kate M. Bouquet of Pinole gives piano lessons at reasonable rates.

Sept. 23, 1905: Half-holiday honor roll list for Plaza School's second grade includes Vincent Scanlan, Louis Ferreira, Myrtle Sweet, Mamie Costa, Lucy Azevedo, Corrine Walton, Hazel Downer, Beatrice McKenzie, and Annie Lewis.

May 6, 1906: Pinole prepares to celebrate a glorious Fourth of July, one of the liveliest celebrations in the county. Committee meetings will be held in Green-

of Miss Ida Fraser, daughter of John Fraser of Pinole, to Howard Pointsett, son of Mrs. E.M. Downer. Wedding at the Fraser house on San Pablo Avenue and reception at the E.M. Downer house.

Aug. 27, 1916: Pinole's worst thunderstorm in memory. For four hours, wind, rain and

PHS FLAG DAY ESSAY CONTEST A HIT IN SCHOOLS

The first Pinole Historical Society Flag Day Essay Contest received high marks from principals and teachers, who were grateful for the recognition of their students.

Students in Pinole schools were given the opportunity to answer the question, "What does the American flag mean to you?"

Essays were received from St. Joseph School, Shannon Elementary School, Stewart Elementary School, and Pinole Middle School.

Seven students, whose essays were judged to be the most outstanding (three from St. Joseph, two each from Shannon and Stewart), received certificates, U.S. Savings Bonds from Mechanics Bank; Fernanda Rodrigues, Community Affairs Officer of Mechanics Bank; and Marcia Kalapus, President of the Pinole Historical Society, presented certificates to all of the grade winners, and savings bonds and U.S. flags from the PHS.

All students whose essays were judged by their teachers to be the best in their grade received certificates of merit from the PHS.

The contest ran for three weeks in May, in advance of the June 14 Flag Day celebration.

Judges were Pinole Councilwoman Debbie Long (St. Joseph School), who had the idea for the contest; retired Pinole Valley High School music teacher Nancy Gill (Shannon Elementary School); and Veronica Ahuruonye, Director of Las Deltas Early Intervention Center, a Richmond pre-school

lightning knock down power poles and plunge Pinole and Hercules into darkness. Lightning blows up the Corning house at the Hercules Black Powder Plant.

Oct. 27, 1917: Pinole's first library building built on corner of San Pablo and School Street on a lot owned by R. & Mrs. L.P. Brandt. The building is of corrugated, fireproof sheet metal. Mrs. Annette Brandt is the new librarian. The building replaces the cloakroom book handouts at the opera house.

June 19, 1925: City plans four-day carnival for Pinole, August 27-30. The town trustees reserve the entire block on Tennent Avenue from Main Street to Third Street for the carnival; participants to celebrate the state of California Diamond Jubilee.

September 1949: Mayor Allan Doidge presses the electric button to activate Pinole's first traffic light at the corner of Tennent Avenue and Highway 40.

Jan. 3, 1966: E.M. Downer Jr. opens first Mechanics Bank office in Pinole on Fernandez Avenue.

February 1968: Pinole Historical and Museum Commission founded and given official status by Pinole City Council. Members are: George R. Vincent, Mrs. M.L. Fernandez, Mrs. Florence Bifford, Mrs. Jessie Clark, Edgar Vovsi, W. "Bud" Wakeland, and George Dutra.

April 25, 1971: First Pinole Historical Appreciation Day held at Margaret Collins School. There is a very large attendance of families of early settlers. First public viewing of the 10 historical scrapbooks cataloging Pinole's history.

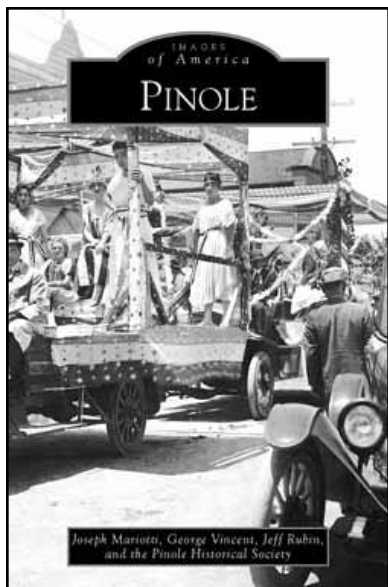
